
A Patchwork Family by Cathy Bramley

A Feel Good comfort read to curl up with



But no bodies are appearing - it's almost as if the victims never existed. Lucy must chase a trail of dead ends and false starts as the disappearances mount up.


But when her father gets caught in the crossfire, the investigation suddenly becomes a whole lot more bloody.

Recipes:

I'd like to share some easy to follow and lovely to eat recipes from family, friends, colleagues and some that I've come across

Ravioli Lasagne

Have a go at this simple recipe. It only takes 15 mins to prepare and uses just 5 ingredients, including shop bought ravioli \odot

Serves: 2 adults and 2 children depending on your portions



Ingredients:

Oil, for frying

6 sausages

2 x 400g tins chopped tomatoes with garlic and basil

200g baby spinach

500g spinach and ricotta ravioli (or any flavour you like)

75g mixture of grated cheddar and mozzarella

Method:

- Heat a drizzle of oil in a pan.
- Squeeze the sausage meat from the skins and fry until browned, using a wooden spoon to break it up.
- Add the tomatoes and half a can of water and season.
- Simmer for 20 mins.
- Put the spinach in a <u>colander</u>.
- Pour over boiled water from the kettle to wilt.
- Leave to cool, then squeeze out as much of the excess water as you can.
- Heat the oven to 200C/180C fan/gas 6.
- Spoon a third of the sauce into a medium baking dish (about 18 x 20cm).
- Top with a third of the spinach and a third of the ravioli, then scatter over some of the cheese.
- Repeat the layers twice, making sure the final layer of ravioli is nestled into the sauce.
- Bake for 35-40 mins until bubbling and hot all the way through.
- Cover if the top starts to get too dark.
- Serve and enjoy



Tuesday: Summer of Sam 9pm Sony Movies (Freeview 32, Sky 321, Virgin 425, Freesat 302)



Thursday: Bait 11.30pm Film 4 (Freeview 14, Freesat 300, Sky 313, Virgin 428)



What's Going On by Marvin Gaye Recommended by Joe In my opinion easily one of the greatest albums of all the time, this concept album from Gaye tells the story from the point of view of a soldier returning from Vietnam, to find his home country in the grips of suffering, hatred and social and racial injustice. It is as relevant today as it was in 1971. Its non-standard musical arrangement heralded a new sound and image for Gaye, and cemented his place as one of the most important artists of the century.

CRAFT TIME

This is a craft that I have seen on the internet and thought it is so simple and green that I wanted to share with you. You can make good use of your old milk/juice cartons. They will make lovely gifts. Plus the birds will love them to.

Bird House/Feeder



All you need is:

Clean and dry recycled milk or juice carton

white paint

Recycled cardboard

PVA glue or glue stick

Foam paintbrush if using PVA glue

Tissue paper in assorted colours

Twine or string

Wooden spoon

Craft knife - ADULTS ONLY

Spray sealer - optional ADULTS ONLY

These handy pictures below provide the step by step stages

Paint the carton white, this will stop the packaging images showing through the tissue paper. Leave to dry

Cut your tissue paper into squares/shapes

When paint has dried, apply the glue to all sides

Start applying the tissue paper shapes. It doesn't matter if they overlap

When you have finished applying the tissue paper, gently brush over with the sponge brush and glue to ensure that all the edges are glued down and secure

Leave to dry





To create the roof

Fold the cardboard in half width wise

Cover with glue and tissue paper just as you did with the sides

If you need to, remove the plastic pouring spout with a knife ask an Adult. ADULTS ONLY see picture

Leave to dry



Cut an Opening for the door ADULTS ONLY

If you are making a Bird Feeder, cut a large rectangular opening

If you are making a Bird House Make a smaller size opening

About an inch below the door, use a knife ADULTS ONLY to cut two small slits making an X shape

Insert the handle of your wooden spoon to create the perch

Before pushing all the way to the back of the carton, add a generous dab of glue, to the end of the spoon, to securely attach the spoon to the back of the carton



On the card for the roof, cut two small slits about 2 inches apart. ADULTS ONLY

Thread through the ends of the twine/string

Tie a knot securely on the underneath side, so you won't see it.

Glue the roof onto the carton

Leave to dry



Give the bird house/feeder a couple of coats of spray sealer, this is optional

Your Bird House/Feeder is now complete. You can now hang it outside

If you have made a Bird Feeder, fill the bottom up with bird seed before you hang outside

Watch out for the Birds to start using it.
See how many different Birds you can count.


Have Fun

Mickey Bolitar series by Harlan Coben




From internationally bestselling author Harlan Coben comes this first action-packed installment of his bestselling Mickey Bolitar series.
