
I've asked friends, family and colleagues to share with us what they're reading and it's quite a mix!

What are people reading?


With Hope and Love by Ellie Dean

Meanwhile Peggy must say goodbye to several of her evacuee chicks whilst she awaits the return of her family from Somerset and the news that her husband, Jim, can finally come home. It's a dream she's held onto for six long years, but fate has one more twist in store.




Assassin's Fate 3rd book in the Fitz and the Fool Trilogy by Robin Hobb

Harriet receives an unexpected letter telling her she's inherited a substantial bequest from her Cornish grandmother, it seems like the answer to her prayers. She owes money to a loan shark and the threats are getting increasingly aggressive: she needs to get her hands on some cash fast. There's just one problem - Hal's real grandparents died over 20 years ago. The letter has been sent to the wrong person. But Hal knows that the cold-reading techniques she's honed as a seaside fortune teller could help her con her way to getting the money. If anyone has the skills to turn up at a stranger's funeral and claim a bequest they're not entitled to, it's her. Hal makes a choice that will change her life for ever. But once she embarks on her deception, there's no going back. She must keep going or risk losing everything, even her life.

Friday: Old School 10.45pm BBC1



CRAFT TIME

This is a craft that I have seen on the internet and thought it is so simple and green that I wanted to share with you.



YARN BALLS

Yarn balls are colorful, versatile and suitable for so many things. You can thread them together and hang them in your bedroom or hang them in the garden.

Here's how to make them.

You will need and ADULT to help you

MATERIALS

Balloons
Plastic bags to cover the floor
Cooking spray
White glue

cup cornstarch
 cup hot water
 Scissors
 Yarn
 Mixing bowl

INSTRUCTIONS

Blow up balloons to different sizes (filling balloons only halfway will help you achieve a more spherical shape) and knot each balloon

Create a drying area. If you're working outdoors or in the garage, hang up a clothesline. If you're working indoors, suspend a string between two chairs. Be sure to put a dropcloth or several plastic bags under the drying area to catch drips

Hang balloons from strings above the drying area

Spray balloons with cooking spray; this will make it easier to remove the yarn later

In the mixing bowl, mix hot water with cornstarch

Add a bottle of white glue and mix thoroughly

Dip yarn into the glue mixture and gently squeeze out the excess with your fingers — you may want to wear rubber gloves for this step!

Beginning at the knot end, wrap the inflated balloon with the wet yarn. The more you wrap, the denser the ball will be

Wrap in all directions, top to bottom and side to side

When you're satisfied with the wrapping, cut the string

Repeat the process with the remaining balloons

Allow the balloons to dry completely. This may take up to 24 hours. The yarn should be stiff and dry

Pop the balloon. Try very gently kneading the balloon before popping it to separate it from the yarn. Remove the popped balloon

Tip: If the ball collapses a little, inflate a new balloon inside the ball to gently push the collapsed spot back into place, and then pop and remove the balloon.
