

I've asked friends, family and colleagues to share with us what they're reading and it's quite a mix!


What are people reading?

Murder by the Minister **By Helen Cox**

It's a normal day for Kitt Hartley at her job at the University of the Vale of York library, until DI Halloran arrives at her desk to tell her that her best friend, Evie Bowes, is under suspicion of murder. Evie's ex-boyfriend Owen has been found dead - with a fountain pen stabbed through his heart - and all the evidence points to her. Kitt knows there is no way Evie could murder anyone - let alone Owen, who she adored. Horrified that the police could have got it so wrong, Kitt decides there's only one thing to do: she's going to investigate Owen's murder herself. She's read hundreds of mystery novels - how hard can it be? With the help of her assistant Grace, and the occasional hindrance of the library's eccentric regulars, Kitt summons up all her investigative powers and gets to work. She soon discovers that down the quaint streets and snickelways of York lie darker doings than she'd ever dreamed.




Doing Time By Jodi Taylor

Recipes:

I'd like to share some easy to follow and lovely to eat recipes from family, friends, colleagues and some that I've come across

MINI QUICHES



These mini quiches are so quick and easy you could get your little one to help you. They are great for entertaining, for kids' parties and as a snack and can be whipped up in no time!

If you don't have puff pastry, I have made these without and they still come out really good.

Ingredients

Serves: 12

- 3 eggs
- 4 rashers of bacon, diced
- 1 small onion or 1/2 large, diced (you can use red onion for extra colour)
- 2 tablespoons of Cheddar cheese, grated
- 2 to 3 pre-made puff pastry sheets
- salt and pepper to taste
- dash of double cream, optional
- sprinkle of fresh or dried parsley, optional

Method

Prep: 10 min

Cook: 20min

Ready in: 30min

1. Preheat your oven to 180 C / Gas 4.
2. Lightly grease 2 muffin tins (12 cup) with butter.
3. In a bowl, mix the eggs, bacon, onion, cheese, salt & pepper with a fork until all mixed together well.
4. Using a glass or pastry cutter, cut circles out of the puff pastry and place into the greased muffin cups. Spoon the mixture into the pastry. Bake in the oven for 15 - 20 minutes or until golden brown



Monday: Being Blacker **11.30pm BBC2**

One of a number of films showing as part of Black History Month, this documentary tells the story of Steve Burnett-Martin (aka Blacker Dread) and his mother, whom he followed from Jamaica to England. Opening a record store in Brixton, Blacker became a local hero.



Tuesday: Licence To Kill **8pm ITV4**

Timothy Dalton isn't the most celebrated James Bond, but there's plenty of meat to this, his second and final outing as 007. It's a little darker and grittier than his earlier films, as Bond goes rogue and sets off on a mission of revenge after a CIA contact's wife is killed.

Wednesday: A Good Year **6.40pm Sony Movies**

In this soft focus drama, Russell Crowe plays a banker who inherits a French vineyard. Forced to stay longer than he intended, the Provençal loveliness starts to melt his cold heart.



Thursday: Shaun Of The Dead **11.10pm ITV4**

Simon Pegg co-writes this fun zombie movie spoof and also joins a ripping cast that includes his old friend Nick Frost, plus Bill Nighy, Penelope Wilton and Kate Ashfield. It's the offbeat comedy and funny tale of a very British zombie apocalypse.

Friday: X-Men: Days Of Future Past **9pm E4**



CRAFT TIME

This is a craft that I have seen on the internet and thought it is so simple and green that I wanted to share with you.

PAPER PINWHEELS

Paper pinwheels are versatile craft that is easy enough for children can make with little supervision. They can be made with any type of paper you have available.

Paper pinwheels are a great way for budding scientists to test and explore the power of breath and air! The stronger your breath, the faster they will spin


What You'll Need

- Scissors
- Pencil
- Ruler (optional)

- 1-piece Square-shaped paper
- 1 Straw
- 1 Pushpin
- Masking tape

What to do:

Draw lines



Using a ruler, mark the center of your square paper with a pencil. If you do not have a ruler, eyeball at the center point. Next use your ruler to draw a diagonal line from each corner of the paper, halfway to the center dot you just made.

If you are using printed paper where one side is white and the other has a pattern, make sure you draw the lines on the white side of the paper

Cut Down the Lines



Use the scissors to cut down the diagonal lines that you just marked on your paper.

Fold and Pin



Fold every other point into the center dot and put a pushpin through the paper.

This step can be tricky because the points like to escape if you are not holding them tight, so patience is key.

Attach to Straw




Hold the pushpin with gathered points in one hand tightly and use your other hand to push the remainder of the pin through a straw. We used paper craft straws for these pinwheels but you could also attach your pinwheel to a plastic straw or a pencil. Once your pushpin is through the straw, use a little bit of masking tape to make sure no little fingers get stuck by the pin.


