

The sixth book in the **Tennison** series








The Hunted

Recipe:

I'd like to share some easy to follow and lovely to eat recipes from family, friends, colleagues and some that I've come across.

This one is from Lee Our Digital Library Advisor

Beef with barley and mushrooms in slow cooker

Serves 4-6 Cooking time 6-8 hours on low. 3-4 hours on high

Ingredients:

3 tbsp vegetable oil
1kg braising steak cut into 2inch pieces
450g onion, thinly sliced
Salt and pepper
1 bouquet garni made of parsley, thyme and
bay leaf
700ml of beef stock
225g carrots, sliced
2 celery sticks, sliced
150g pearl barley
500g mushrooms, trimmed and sliced
2-3 sprigs of parsley leaves, finely chopped, to
serve



Instructions:

Crusty bread, optional

Preheat the slow cooker if needed. Heat the oil in a large casserole dish over a mediumhigh heat. In batches add the beef and brown on all sides. Remove and set aside.

Reduce to medium heat and add the onions and a little salt and pepper and cook until the onions are lightly browned. Return the beef and add the bouquet garni. Pour in the stock and stir, then add the carrots, celery and barley. Bring to a simmer and transfer to the slow cooker.

Cook on low for 6-8 hours or on high for 3-4 hours. Add the mushrooms for the last 20 minutes.

Discard the bouquet garni and taste the stew to check seasoning adding more salt and pepper if needed. Serve in warm bowls and sprinkle with the parsley with crusty bread on the side.


Wednesday: Out Of The Furnace 1am Channel4



By David Almond


