

By Sara Cox



Her writing conjures up a time of wagon rides and haymaking and agricultural shows, alongside chain smoking pensioners, cabaret nights at the Conservative club and benign parenting.

This funny, big-hearted and often moving telling of Sara's upbringing is not what you'd expect from the original 'ladette', and one of radio's most enduring and well-loved presenters.


3rd Book in The Rosie Project Series


Death in a Desert Land By Andrew Wilson

The Dressmaker of Paris By Georgia Kaufmann



Recipe:

I'd like to share some easy to follow and lovely to eat recipes from family, friends, colleagues and some that I've come across.

This one is from **Lee**

LAMB KOFTA KEBABS



Prep time: 15 minutes Cook: 10 minutes Serves: 8 Easy

Extra time: 2hrs chilling

INGREDIENTS

- 900g Lean minced lamb
- 2 onions, finely chopped
- 15g fresh mint leaves, finely chopped
- 1tbsp ginger paste
- 2tbsp chilli paste
- 2tsp ground coriander
- 2tsp ground cumin
- 2tsp paprika
- 1tsp cayenne pepper
- 2tsp salt
- 4 tbsp vegetable oil
- 8 skewers

METHOD

In a large bowl, mix minced lamb, onions, mint, coriander, ginger paste and chilli paste.

Season with cumin, coriander, paprika, cayenne and salt.

Cover and refrigerate for 2 hours.

Shape 1/8th of the lamb mixture into sausages around skewers. Make sure the meat is spread to an even thickness.

Refrigerate until you are ready to cook.

Brush baking tray liberally with oil and arrange skewers under a hot grill.

Cook for 10 minutes or until well done, turning as needed to brown evenly.






How to be a HERO




