


LIFE SENTENCES


THE TSARINA'S DAUGHTER By Ellen Alpsten

The Godmother's By Monica McInerney



NO SUCH THING AS NORMAL



HOW DID YOU DO??

Recipe:

I'd like to share some easy to follow and lovely to eat recipes from family, friends, colleagues, and some that I've come across.

This one is from **Lee**

CHICKEN KIEV



INGREDIENTS

- 100g softened butter
- 3 tbs finely chopped flat leaf parsley
- 2 garlic cloves, grated
- 1 tsp salt
- ½ tsp cayenne pepper
- 2 large skinless chicken breasts
- 150g plain flour
- 2 large eggs, beaten
- 150g fine panko breadcrumbs
- Vegetable oil or groundnut oil for cooking
- Flaky sea salt

Prep time: about 15 minutes **Cook:** 10-15 minutes **Serves:** 2 **Easy**

METHOD

- In a bowl, beat together the butter, parsley, garlic, salt and cayenne pepper with a spoon.
- Set aside for later but do not refrigerate.
- Take the chicken breasts and using a sharp, thin knife make a small hole at the fattest end, then push the knife into the middle of the breast, trying not to cut all the way through.
- Keep working the knife around to form a large enough opening to get the butter in.
- With a small spoon, fill each of the chicken breasts with as much butter as you can get in the hole.
- Dust the chicken breasts with the flour, then dip them into the beaten eggs
- Finally roll them around the panko breadcrumbs.
- Place the chicken on a plate, cover and refrigerate for at least 20 minutes or until needed.
- Preheat the oven to 200c/gas mark 6.
- Warm a little oil in a large non-stick frying pan over a low to medium heat.
- Place the Kievs in the pan and colour gently for 3-4 minutes on each side.
- When they have taken on a lovely golden colour, sprinkle them with a pinch of flaky sea salt
- place on an oven tray and roast for 10-15 minutes until they are cooked through.
- Serve with chips or a salad.

Dog Chew Toy



You will need

- Scrap fabric
- Scissors

How To:

Cut the fabric into long strips. You choose the size, the longer the strip the bigger the toy. Minimum size $10\text{cm} \times 50\text{cm}$



Trim the top and bottom neatly

Roll the strips into sausage shapes



Tie them securely at the top



Plait the three strips



When you are near the bottom leave some strips unplaited, you can tie securely

Trim the ends to tidy the toy up.



The fourth book in an exciting new series about the wonders of the ocean.


Welcome to Mermaids Rock! The entrance to the mermaid realm in the deep, blue ocean...

With the zoo competing for a special winter award, can Ruby impress the judge ... or will her enthusiasm place her in danger?




SLUG IN LOVE


