

I've asked friends, family and colleagues to share with us what they're reading and it's quite a mix!


What are people reading?

The Oysterville Sewing Circle By Susan Wiggs



Caroline Shelby has come home to Oysterville. In the backseat of Caroline's car are two children who were orphaned in a single chilling moment, five-year-old Addie and six-year-old Flick. She's now their legal guardian - a role she's not sure she's ready for. But Oysterville has changed. Her siblings have their own complicated lives and her aging parents are hoping to pass on their thriving restaurant to the next generation. And there's Will Jensen, a decorated Navy SEAL who's also returned home after being wounded overseas. Caroline is drawn back to her favourite place: the Sewing Shop owned by Mrs. Lindy Bloom, the woman who inspired her and taught her to sew. There she discovers that even in an idyllic beach town, there are women living with the darkest of secrets and one of those women is her. Thus begins the Oysterville Sewing Circle, where Caroline finds the courage to stand and fight for everything and everyone she loves.

The Midnight Library by Matt Haig





Before time runs out, she must answer the ultimate question: what is the best way to live?

Moonflower Murders by Anthony Horowitz

The second book in the **Magpie Murders** series

Retired publisher Susan Ryeland is running a small hotel on a Greek island with her long-term boyfriend. It should be everything she's always wanted. However, she's exhausted with the responsibilities of making everything work on an island where nothing ever does. And she's beginning to miss her literary life in London. And then an English couple come to visit, and the story they tell about a murder that took place on the same day and in the same hotel in which their daughter, Cecily, was married is such a strange one that Susan is fascinated by it. And when they tell her that Cecily has gone missing a few short hours after reading 'Atticus Pund Takes The Case,' a crime-novel Susan edited some years previously, Susan knows she must return to London to find what's happened. The clues to the murder and to Cecily's disappearance must lie within the pages of this novel.

Recipe:

I'd like to share some easy to follow and lovely to eat recipes from family, friends, colleagues and some that I've come across.

This one is from Lee Our Digital Library Advisor

Chicken Chow Mein

Ingredients. Serves 2.

150g of yellow wheat flour noodles
Toasted sesame oil
300g chicken fillets sliced into strips
1 teaspoon of dark soy sauce
1 teaspoon of 5-spice powder
1 tablespoon of cornflour
2 tablespoons of groundnut oil
1 red pepper, deseeded and sliced
150g of bean sprouts
1 large spring onion, sliced length ways
2 tablespoons of light soy sauce
1 teaspoon of chilli sauce, optional
Ground black pepper, optional



Cook the noodles for 4-5 minutes in boiling water. Drain and run under cold water and drain again. Drizzle a few splashes of sesame oil over the noodles and toss to prevent them sticking together.

Season the chicken with the dark soy sauce and coat with the 5-spice powder. Then cover with the cornflower.

Heat a wok over a high heat, add the groundnut oil until its smoking then add the chicken and stir fry until cooked.

Add the red pepper and stir fry for 1 minute, then add the beansprouts and spring onion and cook for another minute. Add the noodles and season with the light soy sauce and 1 teaspoon of sesame oil. If you like you can add the chilli sauce and black pepper.

Toss carefully and serve.



Monday: Inception **9pm ITV4**



Humza Khan is the greatest 11 year old rapper Eggington has ever known: he is Little Badman and soon everyone will know his name.


